

ABCAT[®] HOTTUB

Important! Read this manual carefully before you use the ABCAT[®] HOTTUB

Congratulations with the purchase of your ABCAT[®] HOTTUB. In this manual you can find the most important aspects for an optimal and safe use of the ABCAT[®] HOTTUB.

1. Safety

- **BE CAREFUL:** The ABCAT[®] HOTTUB can be hot!
- The ABCAT[®] HOTTUB may only be used on stoves that are installed outside.
- The ABCAT[®] HOTTUB must be professionally installed.
- It is important that the ABCAT[®] HOTTUB is easily accessible for maintenance.
- Cleaning of the ABCAT[®] HOTTUB may only be done with a cold, not burning stove.

2. Conditions for the use of the ABCAT® HOTTUB

- Chimney:** A minimum of 2 meters of flue pipe going straight up after the ABCAT® HOTTUB must be installed.
- Stove:** The stove must be fitted with a baffle plate and a door through which the combustion chamber can be closed. The air supply must always be fully open.
- Fuel:** Burn a maximum of 2 kg of wood per 30 minutes, divided over 3 to 4 pieces of suitable wood. See the ABCAT® HOTTUB Handbook to read what suitable wood is.

The ABCAT® HOTTUB functions optimally when the stove, chimney, fuel and operation of the stove are well matched. See the ABCAT® HOTTUB handbook for more information.

3. Using the ABCAT® HOTTUB

Always light the fire top-down with sufficient kindling. Refill when the last flames are almost extinguished, or when the smoke regains its odor and color. Do not use more than 2 kg of wood *per half hour*. See the ABCAT® HOTTUB handbook for more details.

4. Cleaning the ABCAT® HOTTUB

The ABCAT® HOTTUB is cleaned by rinsing it with warm water. The frequency depends on different aspects, more details can be read in the ABCAT® HOTTUB handbook. Clean the ABCAT® HOTTUB at least when ash is removed from the stove. More frequent cleaning is recommended for an optimal performance of the ABCAT® HOTTUB.
